

MOST DANGEROUS ROADS FOR WALKING

Brooklyn

129 people were killed on Brooklyn roads in the three years from 2012 through 2014. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Flatbush Avenue, Atlantic Avenue, Eastern Parkway, Rockaway Parkway, and 4th Avenue had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

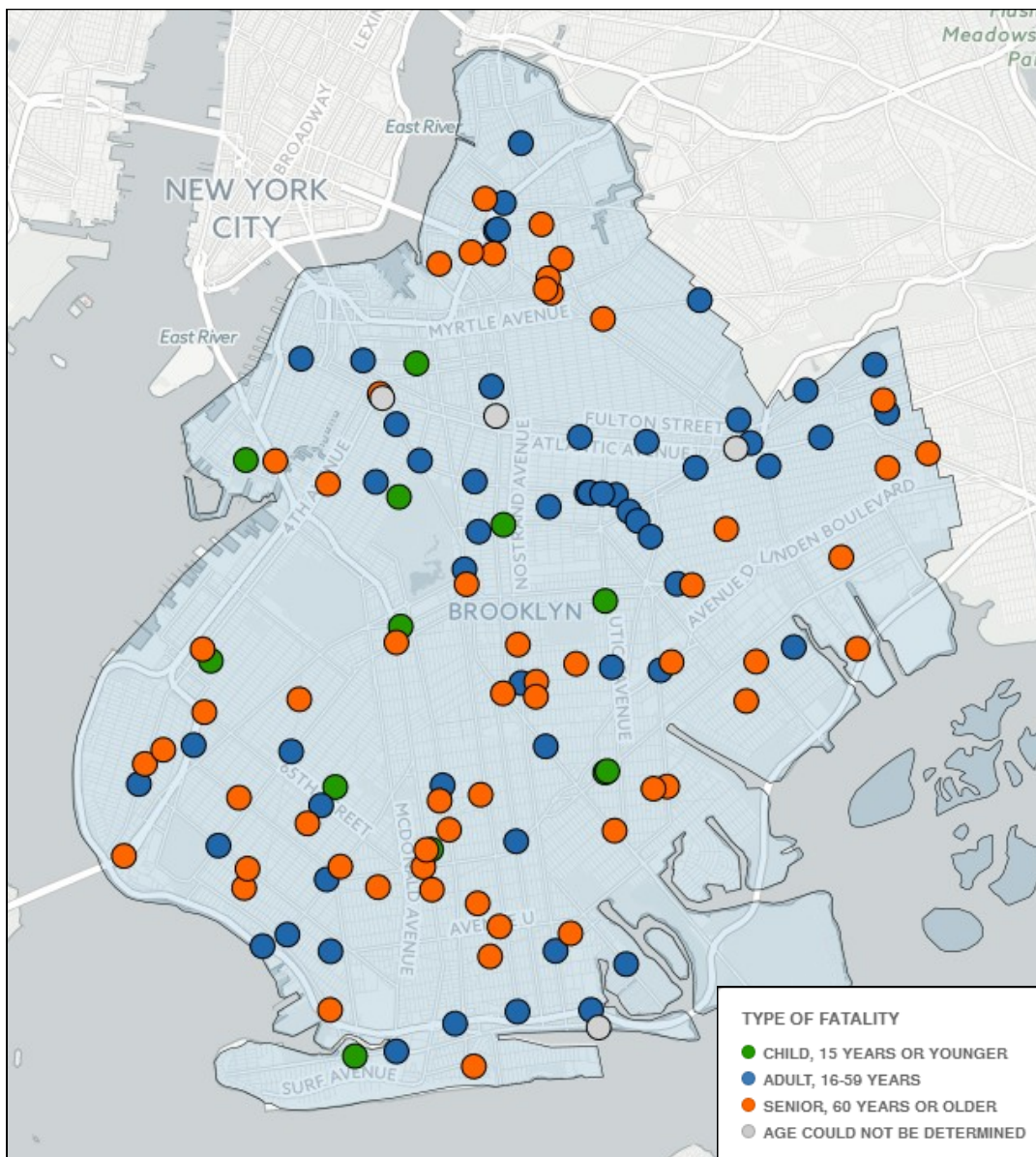
